- Excellent organizational, planning and human relations skills.
- Good knowledge of guidance counselling, career education methods, materials, procedures, and practices.
- Ability to work both as part of a team and independently, in a diverse range of environments.
- Good knowledge of adolescent growth and development, wellbeing, and an understanding of the needs of young people.
- Ability to apply knowledge of contemporary guidance and counselling practices
- Ability to develop cooperative working relationships with students, parents and faculty.
- Ability to maintain accurate records and confidentiality.
- Patience, flexible attitude.
